

BYLAWS
ASSEMBLY OF MAN

PREAMBLE: It has become necessary, because of legal reasons, for the Assembly of Man to formalize and adopt a set of Bylaws under which the Association's activities will be defined and regulated. The close-knit association which has functioned so adequately under the leadership of F. F. Wolff since _____, without necessity for Bylaws, now faces a problem involving land grants which unduly complicates and creates legal problems which can only be resolved by this process. The future may bring other legal problems not now apparent which in turn also would prerequisite a set of Bylaws.

NAME AND DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

The name of the association shall be the "Assembly of Man" and it shall be known as an unincorporated, nonprofit religious association and as such it shall conduct its affairs in compliance with all State and Federal laws relative to maintenance of its status as a nonprofit religious association.

MEMBERSHIP

Upon invitation by the membership committee, a person may thereafter enter into membership by executing a pledge designed by the committee which will test and affirm the intentions of the novitiate to participate in the activities of the association. Membership may be terminated for nonparticipation in activities, unruly behavior, violation of criminal or civil law, immoral conduct and membership in any subversive organization whose activities

are inimical to the best interests of the United States of America.

FEEES AND DUES

Initiation fees and dues may be established by the Board of Directors and changed as necessary from time to time.

OFFICERS OF THE ASSOCIATION

The principal officers of the Organization shall be a President, Secretary, Treasurer and two directors none of whom may hold more than one office. The term of office for each of these shall be five years. Elections shall take place at the usual Summer Convention time commencing in 1965 and each fifth year thereafter. The salary of the President, Secretary and Treasurer may be established from time to time by the Board of Directors.

DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

PRESIDENT- The direction of the principal activities of the association and the conduct of any legal business which may be required of the association shall be the responsibility of the President and his signature will make official any and all documents he is required to effectuate on behalf of the organization.

SECRETARY - All records pertaining to the activities of the organization, including the recording of minutes of any and all meetings, must be maintained in a proper orderly system by the secretary and this shall be his principal responsibility.

DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS (Continued)

TREASURER - The Treasurer shall maintain adequate financial records, prepare such financial reports which may be required, and disburse, accept and otherwise handle the monies, property and all other assets of the association subject to approval of the President who must also countersign all expenditures and investments.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors consists of the President and the two elected directors and this board shall meet regularly and at least once (?) per year at the direction of the President to study and define the general policies under which the affairs of the association shall be conducted. Each member shall have one vote. The secretary shall record the minutes, and preserve them from destruction for the life of the Association.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

The President shall appoint three members to the membership committee who shall formulate rules for initiation of new members, selection of new members and the procedure for voiding memberships; all subject to direction and approval by the President.

ORDER OF CONDUCT OF MEETINGS

Roberts Rules of Order shall be observed for all business meetings. For all other types of meeting the President shall prescribe the procedures and conduct.

TERMINATION OF THE ASSOCIATION

The directors and the principal officers of the association shall maintain current, at all times, the necessary conditional transfer of all assets of the association to a specified nonprofit association or organization whose activities are within the same field as that of The Assembly of Man, to take effect upon the death of all members at any date, or in the event the association has ceased to exist for all practical purposes because of lack of any coherent activity for a period of twenty-five years. It is specifically hereby prohibited to provide for any transfer of such assets whereby they could inure to the benefit of any pro-Communist organization or party.

THE EFFECTUATION OF BYLAWS

The current members of the Assembly of Man, having been canvassed and having recorded assent as shown on the attached affidavits; now therefore be it affirmed that this set of Bylaws becomes effective this date.
