A thought has come to me on this 31st day of March, that may be relevant with respect to the problem that has just been suggested and that is this: that if the thinker does not have a feeling balance, depth thinking is not possible; and, in general, the feminine side represents the principle of feeling and the masculine side the principle of thinking, in the average, there being of course individual exceptions. And if the feeling balance is not established in the individual as an individual entity, then support must come from outside. When the interlock with Gertrude brought about this feeling balance whereby depth thinking became possible, and also the control of what I called the butterfly switch. This is just a point put forth as a suggestion.
